***From the Desk of the City Manager***

The Florida Department of Health is working closely with the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to monitor and respond to the coronavirus outbreak. While it is understandable for anyone watching the news to be concerned, I encourage everyone to remain calm and continue with your standard hygiene protocols.

In Hollywood, City leaders continue to closely monitor the situation and we continue to work closely with our partners at the CDC, Florida Department of Health, Memorial Regional Hospital and other local, state and federal organizations. Our daily operations of City services remain unchanged, including after care programming City staff continues to work with vendors to secure the supply chain, and are assessing internal procedures and protocols to ensure preparation in the event of an emergency. Additional hand sanitizer distribution locations are being deployed at City facilities, and increased communication with employees regarding standard hygiene protocols is ongoing. The City is also exploring telecommunication options for staff should the outbreak reach our doorstep.

The Department of Public Works is obtaining supplies like gloves and wipes which will be distributed as soon as today. Fire Rescue is also securing supplies and PPE, known as personal protection equipment. Additionally, with the assistance of Communication staff, messaging to our vulnerable population has been created. Fire Rescue personal will begin distributing a tips flyer to each and every one of the 40+ nursing homes and assisted living facilities in our City.

The City's Emergency Operations Manager, Jaime Hernandez spoke at Wednesday's City Commission meeting and urged calm and personal preparation. He reminded residents to have an emergency plan, supplies at the ready, and to stay informed. He also shared information regarding the TeleHealth Service offered by Memorial Regional Hospital via their website and the Florida Department of Health telephone hotline. The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) has begun the A1A Tidal Flooding Study. As part of this phased study, crews will begin to study the as-built data and physically inspect the current conditions, existing pipes and seawalls as part of the "field data" phase. Once that information is gathered, it will be inputted into a GIS system to establish a "current conditions" baseline. Phase II of the study will evaluate potential solutions, especially in regards to rainfall and King Tide events as well as sea level rise. Staff will then analyze potential solutions and apply solutions where applicable. Phase I will continue through June, Phase II will begin in mid-April and the entire study is expected by the end of July. The United States Constitution requires that every 10 years a count, or census, is taken of America's population. Census Day is April 1st 2020, however residents should begin seeing invitations to participate beginning next week. I cannot stress enough how important it is for everyone to participate in Census 2020. Some reasons include:

- The census count provides vital information about you and our community.
- It determines how many representatives each state gets in Congress.
- Is used to redraw district boundaries.
- Communities rely on these statistics to plan for a variety of resident needs including new roads, schools and emergency services.
- Businesses use census data to determine where to open or build new homes and buildings.
- Each year the federal government distributes more than \$675 billion dollars for hospitals, schools, fire departments, roads, housing programs, emergencies and natural disasters based on Census Bureau data.

One of the historically undercounted community includes children, even newborns should be counted to ensure an accurate count for our community. Residents will have three options to respond to the census - online, by phone, or by mail. Residents are required by law to participate in the 2020 Census. Below is the Census 2020 schedule:

- March 12-20: An invitation to respond online to the 2020 Census. Some households will also receive a paper questionnaire.
- March 16-24: A reminder letter.
- March 26 - April 3: If you have not responded, you will receive a reminder postcard.
- April 8 - 16: If you still have not responded, you will receive a reminder letter and paper questionnaire.
- April 20 - 27: If you still have not responded, you will receive a reminder postcard to do so.
- After April 27: In-person follow-up.
- 

The invitation to participate in 2020 Census will come from either a postal worker or a census worker with 95% of households receiving their census invitation by mail. 5% of households will receive their invitation when a census taker drops it off and less than 1% of households will be counted in-person by a census taker. Appointment counts will be sent to the President of the United States by December 31, 2020. Redistricting counts will be sent to the states by March 31, 2021.

### **General Obligation Bond Project Improvement Update:**

The Design and Construction Management team partnered with the Art and Culture Center-Hollywood to conduct a Public Meeting on Wednesday evening to discuss the Center's new Multidisciplinary Arts Education facility. The proposed design plan with project information was shared followed by a Q&A session. As a reminder, this project scope includes construction of multipurpose dance/drama room, visual arts and music classrooms, distance learning broadcast studio, mixed-use studio theater, interactive contemporary gallery and meeting/reception room.

On Wednesday, the City Commission authorized staff to proceed with Atkins North America, Inc. to study traffic calming measures in preparation for the establishment of a City-wide Traffic Calming Program. As residents are aware, traffic calming measures are a part of the General Obligation Bond. Atkins expects to present a draft version of the program by the end of this year.

The City's Office of Procurement Services is currently conducting an online auction for surplus city goods. The office has contracted with "Bidera" to handle public auctions of surplus items. As part of this contract, Bidera inspects each item, writes up a description, takes detailed photographs and then hosts the auction. Hollywood is just one of many local municipalities to use the Bidera online auction site to sell surplus items with the goal of realizing the best possible price to the benefit of taxpayers.

Police cars, pick-up trucks, bucket trucks, utility trucks and various types of trailers, pumps, tractors, golf carts and other miscellaneous vehicles are up for auction right now. In total, there are 84 vehicles in this auction lot. **Department of Design & Construction Management  
State Road 7 / US 441 Landscape and Irrigation**

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) State Road 7 / US 441 roadway widening project began in early 2015. The final phase for the project, "Landscape and Irrigation" has begun along the south corridor in Hollywood. Scheduled to take place thru the end of this year, the nearly four mile-long stretch from Pembroke Road north to Stirling Road shall be handsomely outfitted with various trees, palms, bushes and sod within the roadway center medians and along three engineered highway storm water retention swales, or "ponds".

Together with the City of Hollywood, FDOT and their landscape architect have planned for additional landscaping to accompany the decorative sidewalks already constructed at the ponds, in an effort to create unique and attractive park-like settings along the corridor. Notable shall be the new "Linear Park", along the eastern edge of the roadway from Hollywood Boulevard north to Johnson Street. This narrow ½ mile-long, passive park shall not only act as a sound and visual buffer between the heavily traveled roadway and the neighboring Hollywood Gardens West community, but also provide residents and visitors a pedestrian-friendly respite within rapidly redeveloping West Hollywood. Alternative means of commuting shall also be reinforced through the park's connectivity to the County designated Gateway Transit Mobility Hub (currently in development), located at the State Road 7 / Hollywood Boulevard intersection.

### **Broward County Waterway Cleanup Saturday, March 7**



Once the chip is registered, pets are safeguarded in case they become lost or stolen. If your pet has already received a current rabies vaccination and license tag, please bring a COPY of the Rabies Certificate with you to the event to receive the free microchip. You must be a Broward County resident to attend. No appointment necessary. First-come, first-served. Dogs must be on a leash and all cats must be in carriers. No cash or checks please; only debit and credit cards will be accepted.


