From the Desk of the City Manager

The Office of Communications, Marketing and Economic Development has been working with our Departments of Public Utilities and Public Works to provide information to our customers about the new utility rate structure. We have included information on our utility bills, on social media, on our government access channel, in email notifications and online. As you know this is the first utility rate increase in five years and is structured to encourage water conservation. The new rates will provide needed funding for mandatory water and wastewater system upgrades to meet state and federal regulations and the renewal and replacement of aging equipment and infrastructure. This will ensure the safety and reliability of the system and address growth and expansion.

We are also making sure customers know about the adjustments to the sanitation fee schedule. All City of Hollywood single family home and duplex apartment sanitation customers receive solid waste and recycling collection services provided by Waste Pro, USA. The rates associated with the new contract, the City just executed, are now in effect. The new monthly rate for single family homes and duplex apartments is \$38.00 for twice-weekly garbage collection, weekly recycling and commingled collections, and material processing and disposal. The City's sanitation collection rate had not been increased in more than 8 years. The new fees will help to cover increases in materials processing and disposal charges.

As a reminder, Waste Pro collections begin at 7:00 a.m. except on Hollywood Beach where they begin at 8:00 a.m. For additional information regarding collection services and requirements, please visit www.hollywoodfl.org and search "Garbage and Recycling."

On Wednesday the City Commission approved the issuance of a purchase order for the new 100' Ladder Tower Fire Truck. This is a \$1.3 million dollar purchase as part of the voter-approved General Obligation Bond. This new truck was designed, in coordination with Fire staff and the vendor, and will now go into the production line. Assembly of large-scale trucks of this magnitude takes about one year from start to finish. The new truck is expected to be delivered next Fall.

Applications are being accepted now for financial assistance for the owner-occupied housing rehabilitation program. An Interlocal Agreement (ILA) between Broward County, the City of Hollywood and the Hollywood Community Redevelopment Agency will provide a significant new funding source to support the City's "Neighborhood Pride Program". The program includes advancing affordable housing, infrastructure and work skills initiatives in the City's low to moderate income (LMI) neighborhoods over the next several years. As part of the Neighborhood Pride Program, applications are being accepted now for financial assistance to rehabilitate owner-occupied homes in designated LMI neighborhoods.

The Owner-Occupied Housing Rehabilitation Program provides funding for exterior housing rehabilitation improvements. Funding could be used to pay for labor, materials, and other related delivery costs incurred to improve the exterior appearance of a single family home. The expansion of the City's Commercial Property Improvement Program (CPIP) increased the number of eligible properties from 80 to over 800. After focused marketing and outreach efforts by the CMED team, the incentive program is gaining in momentum. Hundreds of businesses have learned about the program via the City of Hollywood's social media channels (Facebook, LinkedIn, Instagram, Twitter), through the City's Economic Development webpage www.ChooseHollywoodFL.com, and an additional 650 property owners were contacted through direct mail. To date, Economic Development staff has responded to 70+ CPIP inquiries and conducted 34 pre-application one-on-one meetings. Seven applicants have completed their pre-application conferences and have submitted applications. Six applications have been completed and are ready for review by the Evaluation Panel. CMED is proud to announce Herb Conde-Parlato, Economic Development Manager, is now a member of the 2020 Urban Land Institute (ULI) Leadership Institute. ULI's Leadership Institute is an immersive and engaging leadership program that educates and prepares emerging leaders with the tools to solve South Florida's most critical real estate and land use issues. The culminating exercise for Leadership Institute participants is a Leadership Project, where teams work over a seven-month period to address a particular local land use or policy challenge.

There's a new distillery and tasting room in Hollywood. ZÍAMI Rum held their Ribbon Cutting Ceremony on Thursday and Economic Development staff was there to welcome this new business to Hollywood. ZÍAMI features Florida crafted rums, which is made with locally sources ingredients and sugarcane grown in Florida. ZÍAMI is just one of the new businesses located within the City's federally designated Opportunity Zone. "We decided to open our distillery and tasting room in Hollywood because the location provides outstanding access and value for both our wholesale and retail operations, and the City has been very accommodating to us," explained Victor Olshansky, Founder & CEO of ZÍAMI Rum.

CMED's FastTrac® Start-Up program, a 10-module course designed to take a business from concept to launch, held its 5th session, Reaching and Analyzing the Market, on October 17th at ArtsPark at Young Circle. Economic Development staff helped participants analyze their industry, competition, ideal target market, market position and pricing strategy in order to further develop their marketing plan. Guest speaker Wendy Rolon of Hollywood-based marketing firm the Pink Collective discussed tracking growth potential, markets and customers.

Economic Development staff also attended the October 14th meeting of the Alliance of Entrepreneur Resource Organizations (AERO). Partners discussed upcoming events and programs, shared feedback and plans for the fourth quarter of 2019.

CMED submitted a proposal, on behalf of the City, to the Leadership Institute and was subsequently selected as one of the Leadership Projects for the 2020 academic year. The project will consist of the study of the 170-acre South Florida Design and Commerce Center and address strategies to promote redevelopment, investment, transportation opportunities and needs of the area. The results of the study will have a beneficial impact on the City and consist of a written report and presentation outlining the team's approach, research, and recommendations.

Staff attended the Greater Fort Lauderdale Alliance Annual Dinner at the Signature Grand in Davie which celebrated the successes of 2018. From 2007 to 2019, the Alliance, working with its members, Broward County and other partners, helped create or retain 36,000 direct jobs that are estimated to generate \$14.2 billion in annual economic impact in Broward County and total employment of approximately 74,000 jobs through direct, indirect and induced efforts.

A Communications staff member is representing the City in the Greater Hollywood Chamber of Commerce's Leadership Hollywood Class 44. The class kicked-off at last Friday's Good Morning Hollywood Breakfast. A day-long retreat at the Double Tree by Hilton Hollywood Beach followed.

Each year the City supports the Chamber's Leadership Hollywood class by enrolling several staff members from various departments city-wide. It's a great opportunity for participants to network with local community and business leaders and take an active role in community affairs. The Leadership class runs through May 2020.

In a continuing effort to achieve ADA compliance, Communications staff attended the second of three Accessible Documents Workshops. These learning workshops are presented by the FAU Florida Institute of Government and are held at the Boca Raton Fire Rescue Administration Center. This hands-on session focused on making PDF documents accessible. Upon completion of the training, staff will then craft an in-house training program to share what they have learned with all City staff members who serve as the website liaison for their department or office.

Communications staff produced several new graphics for Parks, Recreation & Cultural Arts events, signage for the November 2nd Tree Planting, an informational sign for the Marina Improvement Project, and an invitation for the upcoming Fire Station 45 Grand Opening which is taking place on Monday, November 18th at 11:00 a.m. at the Station.

Video Production staff broadcast the City Commission Meeting on Wednesday where the recently completed Diamond Service Award Winner video was highlighted. Production is also underway on the Fire Rescue Recruit Training video. Communications staff also participated in a brainstorming session where creative ideas were discussed on a number of city-related topics. Staff also assisted with a number of media inquiries regarding the winners of the Cardboard Boat Race and \$1.3 million dollar purchase of the new fire truck. Staff booked interviews with a local radio station and area magazine for the Mayor and a Commissioner and crafted talking points on a number of topics. They also worked to finalize the Building Broward Breakfast that will be held on Tuesday morning at the CIRC Hotel.

Phase II of Royal Poinciana Neighborhood Utility Project Begins

As part of the City of Hollywood's continuing effort to provide and maintain high quality utility services to its residents, the Department of Public Utilities has contracted with Lanzo Construction Company to install new water mains and a new sewer system in the Royal Poinciana neighborhood. Work will be done in a phases through December 2022 and will take place from 7:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. in the area of Sheridan Street to Hollywood Boulevard from US1 to North 21st Avenue.

Phase II began Tuesday, October 1st in the area between Sheridan Street and Scott Street from Federal Highway to 21st Avenue. This portion of the project is estimated to be completed by December 30, 2019.

Residents are asked to refraining from parking and/or placing any personal items within the work zone and the public right-of-way during construction to avoid possible damage. If conditions are identified that will require additional work, residents will be notified accordingly. During the course of this project, residents will be impacted as traffic will be re-routed as necessary to accomplish the work. Access to the project area may be limited at times. Important information about your Utility Rates

The City of Hollywood recently approved a new utility rate structure that includes a rate increase while encouraging water conservation. Over the past five years the City focused on maintaining the rate structure, while finding alternative solutions to operational cost increases. Making rate adjustments now allows us to fund mandatory water and wastewater system upgrades needed to meet state and federal regulatory requirements, the renewal and replacement of aging equipment and infrastructure, and ensure the safety and reliability of the system and projects necessary for future growth and expansion.

On October 1, 2019, the City of Hollywood implemented a new, simplified tiered rate structure for water and wastewater customers. Previously, the City had a 15 tier structure. The new modified three tier structure is designed to reward customers who conserve water and create an incentive for those who currently do not. This allows customers greater control over their monthly bill. The charges for water increase as usage increases. Simply put, the more water a customer consumes, the higher the rate they are charged.

The City's stormwater rate has remained unchanged for more than 10 years. The new rate was increased by \$2.90 and took effect beginning October 1, 2019.

Additionally, all water customers will see a slight increase to the monthly base rate. For seasonal customers who live here less than 12 months a year, the minimum monthly base rate will be charged regardless of use. New Sanitation Fee In Effect For Single Family Homes and Duplex Apartments

City of Hollywood sanitation customers receive solid waste and recycling collection services provided by Waste Pro, USA. The Department of Public Works, Environmental Services Division oversees these services for the City's single family homes and duplexes. A new monthly sanitation fee for the collection, processing and disposal of solid waste, garbage, commingled waste and recyclable materials went into effect October 1st for these properties.

The new monthly rate for single family homes and duplex apartments is \$38.00 for twice-weekly garbage collection, weekly recycling and commingled collections, and material processing and disposal. The City's sanitation collection rate has remained unchanged for more than 8 years, this \$7.00 increase reflects new contractual obligations as well as an increase to the overall material processing and disposal fees charged to the City by the vendor.

Annual increases to the rate will be determined based on contractual obligations and program administrative costs. Estimated increases are as follows: October 1, 2020: 6.43%; October 1, 2021: 5.32%; October 1, 2022: 3.56%; and October 1, 2023 - October 1, 2029: 2.50%, annually. Additionally, beginning in October 2020, household bulk collections will transition to a once monthly collection. Yard waste collections will remain on a weekly schedule.
